General Description

Saint-Emilion is the oldest wine area of the Bordeaux region. The UNESCO organization recognized the great terroir of Saint Emilion and put the site on the World Heritage List .

Saint Emilion wines are considered the most robust of the Bordeaux. They are generous, very colored, and reach their maturity quicker than other red Bordeaux.

Château du Rocher is one of the oldest growths in Saint Etienne de Lisse and dates back to 15th century according to the family archives.

Wine Tasting Notes

Beautiful aspect of a dark and deep red.

The complex nose evokes ripe grapes.

The marvelous taste continues with elegant and full tannins. Although the tannins are tight, this St. Emilion is silky in the mouth with notes of very ripe grapes. The Cabernet grapes reinforce the fruit and render the bouquet more complex. Its pleasant and powerful structure makes it a robust wine.

Specifics

Grape Varieties: Merlot 70 %, Cabernet Sauvignon 20 %, Cabernet Franc 10 %. Average vine age 30+ years.

The grapes are picked-out on a double table in order to ensure a better quality.

This wine benefits from thermoregulation by heat-exchange.

The wine-making of our parcels separately includes a cold pre fermentation maceration of 4 to 5 days and a post fermentation maceration of 15 to 20 days depending on the vintage and the grape variety.

Ageing in French oak barrels lasts 12 months. Estate bottled.
